- 2. Prepare at least 10 clear questions on the template provided. Plan to ask 5 of the most important questions, but be prepared to use some of the other questions if the interview goes differently from what you anticipate.
- 3. Contact the adult to request permission to interview him/her. Practice explaining your assignment and asking for their help in a polite and persuasive way. For Example:

- 4. Arrange a convenient time and place to meet each other. Please plan ahead. Asking a busy adult to help you at the last minute is not polite so, DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE!
- 5. During the interview, take quick notes that help you remember the answers. You will write out these responses on the Interview Template next to the questions after the interview.
- 6. If possible, take a photo of the person you interview or their classroom/office space. Include this on your Interview Report.
- 7. Your written report is due on May 23. You will make a brief oral presentation to the class on May 30. During your brief presentation, you will select 3 of the best questions and answers to share with the class.
